Advent Coin Collection

In 2022 the church supported the Framework Charity through its annual Advent coin collection. A total of £280 was raised through the Advent season.

Framework was formed in 2001 after the merger of two Nottingham-based charities, Macedon and Nottingham Help the Homeless Association (NHHA). It is a charity delivering housing, health, employment, support and care services to people with a diverse range of needs across the East Midlands.

Regardless of their past, or the challenges they face, the charity empowers people to achieve financial stability, social inclusion and independence, because it believes that everyone has the right and potential to achieve a better future.

Framework supports more than 18,000 people a year providing a network of interlinking services that have the potential to change and even save people's lives.

- It gives support and advice to people facing homelessness
- It helps people off the streets
- It houses people who are homeless and support them to move on to independent accommodation
- It supports people to address their addictions and to improve their mental and physical health
- It empowers disadvantaged and excluded people to learn new skills and find employment

Every person helped is different, with their own challenges and aspirations for the future.

Figures from 2018/19

- * **3,378** the number of people supported in their own homes
- * **2,004** the number of people supported into education, volunteering and employment
- * **3,235** the number of people accommodated in our housing
- * **1,052** the number of people supported to address their alcohol and drug issues.

Church Improvements

During the past thirty months we have carried out a tremendous amount of work transforming the main church building and adjacent church house for the benefit of our church members and the wider community.

Church House is now rented providing accommodation for a family and bringing in funds to assist the church in its day-to day activities.

As Christians we are committed to reducing our environmental impact on the planet and so after installing the electric heating system, we have also replaced the gas cooker with an electric one thus making our church free from fossil fuel. In order to successfully complete the above conversion, we had to increase the electricity supply to the building at considerable cost.

The front entrance hall has been fully upgraded to a high standard making it more welcoming and comfortable for our members and the whole community. It is now a multifunctional space that can be utilised for various activities.

Following a structural survey of the building ,and although it was found to be fairly structurally sound, the roof was in a very poor state and needed extensive repairs. Repairs have been done, but as an old building we have to constantly keep an eye on it.

All of the old light fittings (99.9%) have been removed and replaced with LED which is more energy efficient and will save the church long term.

The carpet in the sanctuary was crumbling and that also has been replaced.

Extensive repairs have been carried out on one of the stained glass windows in the sanctuary.

The whole of the church building has been completely redecorated making it comfortable and welcoming to all who access the facilities.

The work that has been done over the last months took a lot of time and effort and although I was leading the push to get these done, thanks must go out to the following: Andrea church coordinator, Andy church minister, Dave former church secretary, Jean church secretary, Mary, Lloyd Burrell, Ryan the roofer, Patrick the handyman, Hermione the interior designer and all the people who donated to the church that allows us to carry out such an extensive piece of work.

In 2022 the INF (International Nepal Fellowship) celebrated 70 years of service in Nepal. The INF is the partner of the BMS (Baptist Missionary Society) in Nepal.



For many Christians in Nepal, the year 1952 marked the opening of the first Christian Churches, as well as the start of faith-inspired medical work. Key to the early leprosy work were the lives of medical missionaries **Eileen Lodge** and **Betty Bailey** (pictured), who overcame many obstacles to establish treatment for leprosy sufferers.

Last November, Pippa and I

were invited to the INF celebration, where reference was made to these early pioneers. We were given tokens of appreciation from the INF which we accepted on behalf of BMS, which has supported the work. Since **you** are the people behind BMS we want to pass on the thanks. Through your prayer and giving you are directly impacting Nepal for the better. **THANK YOU.**



INF have just confirmed that the new leprosy inpatient facility at Green Pastures Hospital, which I have written about previously, will be called the '**Eileen and Betty Centre**'.



The facility is almost completed, and I am looking forward to the commencement of medical work in early 2023. The picture shows me reviewing site matters with the nursing Sister with whom we have worked closely. It is a delight to see the results of the work emerge.

Despite continued growth as a Nepali organisation, INF continues to have a need for expat input. Pippa and I have been invited to continue supporting INF into 2023. With God's grace and your partnership, we want to rise to any challenges which await.

Note: Those who regularly follow the Vokuhls may remember that they were apprehensive about obtaining visas allowing them to stay in Nepal. At the time of writing this letter (early December) the family was, in fact, in Thailand, as visa issues meant leaving Nepal. Toby wrote that they were hopeful of returning in January. He wrote:

The uncertainty leading up to this outcome has been difficult for the family at times. However, we can affirm that God has been faithful, and is providing for us. May we be open to what He wants to teach us during this time. This could be a good time to gain perspective on 2023 plans and intentions.

Toby asked for our prayers:

- 1) May I request prayer for resilience for our children, as home-schooling has never been in favour with them, and the recent relocation means distance learning, and more transitions. ***Please pray*** for protection for them physically, mentally, and spiritually.
- 2) Having started to make connections in Kathmandu, ***do pray*** for all naturally emerging relationships in our neighbourhood, and that on return to Nepal we would have wisdom to see where we can be Christ's 'hands and feet', also growing our connections with local Christians and encourage them.
- 3) ***Do pray*** for INF, and all within the organisation who wholeheartedly carry out their work as ministry with a Christian ethos and mindset. ***Please pray*** for strong and faithful leadership, to steer the organisation through any challenges which arise from operating within this challenging context, and in face of some anti-Christian sentiment.
- 4) There are many needs in the immediate and wider environments surrounding us in Nepal. ***Please pray*** that Pippa and I have wisdom to know what to focus on as we, God willing, return to Nepal in January 2023.
