I was reminded recently of the image of the church as a tree. Each one of us initially in isolation is like a freshly planted seed. When the seed springs to life it does two things: it starts to put down roots, which over time spread, going deeper into the soil which provides the plant with life giving water ; the roots become stronger and anchor the plant firmly in place. The seed also sprouts shoots, which move slowly towards the surface, seeking out the light which will provide energy for new growth.
