PRAYER

I am always conscious that it is easy write about the many aspects of prayer, but that prayer itself involves discipline, persistence and a willingness to listen carefully to what God is saying.

Continue steadfastly in prayer, being watchful in it with thanksgiving. Colossians 4:2

We all pray in many different ways; we can use the Lord's prayer; we may use many words or just a few. Sometimes we are not sure what to say, and prayer becomes a real challenge. It is good to remember that God cares more about what is in our hearts than our eloquence. A humble attitude in prayer may mean that we may just sit in silence and listen with faith and trust in God's timing. Whatever the situation God needs us to pray authentically, expressing our real feelings.

Likewise, the Spirit helps us in our weakness. For we do not know what to pray for as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groanings too deep for words. Romans 8-26

The answers we get to our prayers can be clear. We may see something that we expected to happen because of our prayers but often something new, different or unusual happens. Sometimes it's difficult to see an answer at all, but we are taught to be persistent, to persevere, to hope.

Therefore, I tell you, whatever you ask in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours. Mark 11:24

The Bible encourages us to pray for our own needs, for the needs of others, and for God's will to be done.

Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. Philippians 4:6

- 1. <u>Why Pray?</u> "Lord, teach us to pray"
- 2. <u>Adoration</u> "Our Father in Heaven. Hallowed be your name"
- 3. <u>Petition</u> "Give us this day our daily bread"
- 4. Intercession "Your kingdom come"
- 5. <u>Unanswered Prayer</u> "Your will be done"
- 6. <u>Contemplation</u> "On earth as it is in heaven"
- 7. <u>Listening</u> "Give us this day our daily bread"
- 8. <u>Spiritual Warfare</u> "Deliver us from evil"

The course will begin on Thursday 20th February at 11am in church and then every 2 weeks with a break over Easter. Each session will be about an hour.

History in the Making

In our beautiful city of Nottingham, a bronze statue of two women depicting an enslaved woman from the Americas and Caribbean and a local cotton mill worker was unveiled at the Broad Marsh Open Space on Sunday 9th February 2025.



The unveiling of the statue emerged from a journey of over 10 years work through 3 voluntary community-led projects, namely *Bright Ideas*, *Legacy Makers* and *Standing In This Place*. The aims of these projects were to enable sharing of information, raising awareness about ancestry legacy and the contributions of

enslaved people to the world.

The statue under the heading of **Standing In This Place** looks to highlight contributions and connections between white mill workers and black enslaved women uprooted to the Americas, showing how their stories and history are connected by cotton, sorrow, strength and resilience. The project has brought together people from varying nationalities and cultures reinforcing *there is more that unites than divides*.



Looking closely at the two women clasping hands through the journey and history of cotton and time—the power of God's love unites.
