# Thought for the Month from Susan Bye "WOW" moments with God

One of our sessions with the Reflective Prayer meeting has been around the topic of Worship. This isn't just confined to our Sunday services, but can be experienced regularly in our daily lives. Have you ever experienced a moment that stopped you in your tracks and made you say, "Wow"?

Did anyone catch the exhibition "Threads through the Bible" in Southwell Minster? On display were 44 enormous panels of "textile art" each depicting events in the Bible through Creation, the life of Jesus and the book of Revelation. Looking at these vibrant scenes, I felt a sense of God's presence through the creativity of the artist – Jacqui Parkinson - and her interpretation. The scale of the work she'd completed over 10 years and the detail contained therein was simply awesome and amazing to see her God-given talent.

Last month we also visited the new Sherwood Observatory, where we saw a show in the planetarium which gave me a mind-blowing sense of God's universe—galaxies, stars, planets—all perfectly placed, all declaring the glory of God. Psalm 19:1 says, "The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands." I concluded that although my brain can't comprehend the scale of the universe, I certainly got a "wow" moment to praise God for Earth's creation.

These "wow" moments don't just fill us with awe—they renew our sense of perspective, purpose, and praise. Whether through the beauty of art or the immensity of space, God is constantly inviting us to stop and encounter Him more deeply. So, take time to slow down, look around, and allow yourself to be awed. Let those "wow" moments become worship—reminders that the God who flung stars into space also knows your name.

## **Contactless Giving and Church Donations**

Over £100,000 a year is needed to keep our church running and the income to support this comes from the personal giving of members' and visitors' donations and some legacies.

MRBC now has a new alternative way of accepting our weekly offering and other donations. A card machine is available in the Welcome Hall for your use. Simply choose an amount on the front screen and then swipe your card on the top.

This is of course an alternative option which can be used by those members and visitors who prefer not to carry cash with



them. The most cost-effective option for our regular giving is still by bank transfer or standing order and do ask Alan for details if you would like to do this. There is also the option of weekly envelopes supplied by the church for those who prefer this way of budgeting, and of course loose notes and cash are also most welcome.

All cheque and cash deposits at the bank now incur charges so the deacons are looking to offset these, as well as catering for more modern practices by encouraging more direct giving through standing order or bank transfer. The hope is that the card machine will also go some way to help with this.

#### What is Gift Aid?

Gift Aid is a scheme available to charities, which means they can claim extra money from HMRC. Mansfield Road Baptist Church can claim *an extra 25p* for every £1 which you, as an individual, donate! It means that Gift Aid can increase the value of your donations by 25%.

The church can claim Gift Aid when you make a donation from your own funds as long as you are a UK taxpayer.

In order for the church to claim gift aid, you need to complete and sign a declaration giving permission for this to happen. The form, which will ask for your name, address and signature, can be obtained from me. It only needs to be completed once. (Unless you have a change of address).

The income received by the church from the government through gift aid last year amounted to **over £10,000**!

Please would you consider completing a declaration form or speak with me if you need more information.
